Case Study Child[1] 17-Sep-06 Rebekkah was a friendly, six-year-old girl, who came to the minor illness clinic with her mother. She described how Rebekkah fell off her bike the week before and had many grazed areas, including one on her chin. All the areas had healed well except for the one on her chin, which was still weeping and appeared to be getting larger.

Safeguarding Children – Case Studies Ben is a 7 year-old boy. He lives with his mum Angela. Angela frequently goes out in the evening leaving Ben locked in a large cupboard under the stairs. She gives Ben a blanket and a pillow so he can go to sleep. SECTION 47 Ben appears to be suffering or at risk of suffering significant harm.

The children were placed with relatively new foster carers, Tim and Annie (white carers) who wish to keep the children long term, although formal matching has not taken place. The carers have a supportive attitude to contact, although this stops short of facilitating contact at the placement or being directly involved in any supervision.

Case studies are commonly used in social, educational, clinical, and business research. A case study research design usually involves qualitative methods, but quantitative methods are sometimes also used.
