Clinical reasoning is both related to and informed by critical thinking skills, which describe one's ability to use higher cognitive processes such as analysis, synthesis, and self-reflection, skills necessary to demonstrate effective clinical reasoning. 3

Clinical reasoning is related to and dependent on critical thinking skills, which are defined as one's capacity to engage in higher cognitive skills such as analysis, synthesis, and self-reflection. The authors review how an understanding of the cognitive psychological principles that contribute to effective clinical reasoning have led to strategies for teaching clinical reasoning in the ICU.
